### The Covid-19 plan:

As communicated separately, the latest information provided by the Premier includes:

- **Places of worship** have a density requirement of **1 person per 2 sqm.**
- **Funerals** are capped at 200 people and **requiring 1 person per 2 sqm.**
- **Weddings** are capped at 200 people and **requiring 1 person per 2 sqm.** The digital contact tracing form is still required.
- COVID Safe Check-in is still required.

Thank you for your continued efforts in helping keep our communities safe.

Places of worship must be supervised by a COVID Marshal who must have a copy of their training certificate available when conducting COVID Marshal duties and be clearly identified as a COVID Marshal.

As of December 1, all public buildings have been provided a **QR Code**. This code is to be scanned using the MySAGov phone app or using the camera on your smart phone.

Arrangements listed below will be in force until further notice:

#### Our Parish is Committed to Health and Safety.

1. Please scan the **QR Code** located on the door or external wall of the church. If you do not have a smart phone, please write your name & phone number in the Register upon entry.
2. Use the sanitizing gel provided at the Church entrance.
3. Sit only in the designated numbered pews in the Church.
4. Except for families and household groups, people should be at least 2 meters apart.
5. Holy Communion is given only in the hand.
6. Ensure that there is the 1.5m distance between you and the person in front when processing for Holy Communion.
7. Please remember to wipe down the area where you have been sitting/kneeling in the pews and use the sanitizing gel provided on your way out.
8. Keep the social distancing requirement when leaving the Church after Mass.
9. Please don't go back to the entrance door. Entry and Exit rule must be followed for your safety.
10. If you are unwell please consider the health of our community and stay home until you are better.
11. Your cooperation with these requirements is greatly appreciated.



### Global Day of Climate Action

March 11 2021 will be the start of a multi-faith Year of Action around the world leading up to crucial international climate negotiations (COP26) in Glasgow in November 2021. People of all faiths will continue to call urgently at international and national levels for a compassionate, just response to COVID-19 and the climate emergency. At 11am Thursday March 11 2021 (local time), many faith communities around the world will be taking part in a multi-faith Sacred People Sacred Earth global day of action on the climate crisis organised by a grassroots Greenfaith International Network from 14 countries (Australia, Indonesia, India, Brazil, Chile, South Africa, Kenya, Nigeria, Uganda, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Canada, America, & the UK). The Australian Religious Response to Climate Change (ARRCC) is coordinating the Australian response. ### Reflection on 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent (YEAR B) 07/03/2021

Reading: Ex 20:1-17; I Cor 1:22-25; Jn 2:13-25

**Introduction:** Today's readings from Holy Scripture teach us that Lent is the ideal time to clean out the Temple of our own hearts and to offer to God proper Divine worship by obeying the Ten Commandments. They also teach us that our *New Covenant* with God demands that we should keep our parish Church holy and our Divine worship vibrant by our active participation in the liturgy with hearts cleansed by repentance, and holy by allowing the Holy Spirit to control our hearts and lives.

**Scripture lessons:** Today's first reading teaches us that the Ten Commandments are the basis of our religious and spiritual life. Instead of restricting our freedom, the Commandments really help us to love and respect our God and our neighbours. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 18) depicts the Mosaic Law's life-enhancing attributes: it refreshes the soul and rejoices the heart; it is pure and true, more precious than gold. The second reading reminds us that we must appreciate the Divine "foolishness" of the crucified Christ and obey His commandment of love as our expression of Divine worship. Today's Gospel gives us the dramatic account of Jesus' cleansing the Temple of its merchants and moneychangers, followed by a prediction of his death and Resurrection. The synoptic Gospels place the "cleansing of the Temple" immediately after Jesus' triumphant arrival in Jerusalem on the back of a colt on Palm Sunday, while John places it at the beginning of his Gospel. Jesus cleansed the Temple which King Herod began to renovate in 20 BC. The abuses which kindled the prophetic indignation of Jesus were the conversion of God's Temple into a "noisy marketplace" by the animal merchants and into a "hideout of thieves" by the moneychangers with their grossly unjust business practices – sacrilege in God's Holy Place. Jesus' reaction to this commercialized Faith was fierce. Since no weapons were allowed inside the Temple, Jesus had to construct his own weapon, a whip of cords to drive out the merchants and moneychangers from the Court of the Gentiles.

**Message for Life:** 1) **We need to avoid a calculating mentality in Divine worship:** Our relationship with God must be that of a child to his parent, one of mutual love, respect and a desire for the family's good, with no thought of personal loss or gain. We are not supposed to think of God as a vending machine into which we put our sacrifices and good deeds to get back His blessings.

2) **Let us remember that we are the temples of the Holy Spirit:** St. Paul reminds us that we are God's temples, body and soul, because the Spirit of God dwells in us. Hence, we have no right to desecrate God's temple by impurity, injustice, pride, hatred, or jealousy. Let us be cleansed by asking God's forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

3) **Let us love our parish Church as our "Father's house" and use it:** Let us make our Church, our "Heavenly Father's house" a holier place by our active participation in the liturgy, by offering our time and talents in the various ministries and by our financial support for its maintenance and development.
