## Information desk

**The Covid-19 plan:** Places of worship must be supervised by a COVID Marshal who must have a copy of their training certificate available when conducting COVID Marshal duties and be clearly identified as a COVID Marshal.

As of December 1, all public buildings have been provided a **QR Code**. This code is to be scanned using the MySAGov phone app or using the camera on your smart phone.

Arrangements listed below will be in force until further notice: Our Parish is Committed to Health and Safety.

- 1. Please scan the **QR Code** located on the door or external wall of the church. If you do not have a smart phone, please write your name & phone number in the Register upon entry.
- 2. Use the sanitizing gel provided at the Church entrance.
- 3. Sit only in the designated numbered pews in the Church.
- 4. Except for families and household groups, people should be at least 2 meters apart.
- 5. Holy Communion is given only in the hand.
- 6. Ensure that there is the 1.5m distance between you and the person in front when processing for Holy Communion.
- 7. Please remember to wipe down the area where you have been sitting/kneeling in the pews and use the sanitizing gel provided on your way out.
- 8. Keep the social distancing requirement when leaving the Church after Mass.
- 9. <u>Please don't go back to the entrance door</u>. <u>Entry and Exit rule</u> must be followed for your safety.
- 10. If you are unwell please consider the health of our community and stay home until you are better.

# DEATH OF ARCHBISHOP EMERITUS



# PHILIP WILSON 2nd OCT 1950 – 17th JAN 2021

Archbishop Philip Wilson, who served as Bishop of Wollongong and Archbishop of Adelaide during 45 years of priestly ministry, died in Adelaide Sunday afternoon at the age of 70.

He was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle in 1975 and Ordained Bishop of Wollongong in 1996.

In 2001, he was appointed Archbishop of Adelaide, a post he held until his resignation in 2018. He served as president of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference for three consecutive terms, from 2006 to 2012.

Archbishop Wilson had suffered a series of health problems in recent years, including cancer. Even so, his death on Sunday was unexpected.

Philip was much loved by people across the country, but especially in the places he served — in Maitland-Newcastle, in Wollongong and here in Adelaide. He made major contributions to the Church and the wider communities in which he ministered, and was seen as a valuable part of the Bishops Conference, including during four years as president of the national assembly of about 40 bishops. "A harrowing period of allegations, charges, conviction and eventually acquittal was a significant chapter on Philip's life, but his record of supporting and advocating on behalf of victims and survivors is part of his legacy. Philip knew what pain many people had endured and suffered as a result of the sickening actions of some within the Church. He was part of the solution, and widely recognised as such." said Archbishop O'Regan.

Archbishop Wilson's Funeral will be celebrated at 11am on Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> February. It will be livestreamed and the link will be on the Archdiocese website (<a href="https://adelaide.catholic.org.au">https://adelaide.catholic.org.au</a>). There is also an opportunity to pray in the presence of the coffin from 2pm-6.30pm Tuesday 2<sup>nd</sup> February. There will be 20min time allocations available to book through TryBooking
