

#### The Covid-19 plan:

# We are currently Level 1: with some additional Restrictions

Places of worship must be supervised by, and be clearly identified as, a COVID Marshal.

As of December 1, all public buildings have been provided a **QR Code.** This code is to be scanned using the MySAGov phone app or using the camera on your smart phone.

Arrangements listed below will be in force until further notice:

#### Our Parish is Committed to Health and Safety.

- 1. Please scan the **QR Code** located on the door or external wall of the church. If you do not have a smart phone, please complete the Contact Register upon entry.
- 2. Use the sanitizing gel provided at the Church entrance.
- 3. As of August 12, seating restrictions are as follows 3 person per 4 square metres.
- 4. **MASKS** are mandatory for shared indoor public places so **EVERYONE MUST** wear a Mask over the nose & mouth while inside the Church. The Celebrant is permitted to remove their mask while saying Mass.
- 5. Holy Communion is given only in the hand.
- 6. Everyone must take reasonable steps to maintain 1.5m physical distancing at all times. People from the same household may sit together. Please keep the social distancing requirement when processing for Holy Communion and when leaving the Church after Mass.
- 7. Please remember to wipe down the area where you have been sitting/kneeling in the pews and use the sanitizing gel provided on your way out.
- 8. Please follow the ENTRY and EXIT rules.
- 9. If you are unwell please consider the health of our community and stay home until you are better.
- 10. As of September 9, Funerals & Weddings are now capped at 150 people but must have an independent COVID Marshal if more than 50 people are in attendance. Your cooperation with these requirements is greatly appreciated.

#### A LITTLE HISTORY OF MASS OFFERINGS

The offering of Mass stipends is an ancient tradition in the Church. The priest who celebrates the Holy Mass does so for the intentions of the person who has given the Mass offering, whether it be for a sick person or the soul of a departed loved one or for some other private intention. The money given is in no sense a "payment" for the Mass but rather a free gift, given in gratitude and for the material support of the priest himself. For many priests in the poorest parts of the world, who often have no other means of support, such Mass offerings are a vital contribution to their survival and to their work on behalf of the whole parish.

The Canon Law on Mass offerings is contained more particularly in Canons 945-958 with which all priests should be familiar and the Norms established by the Congregation for the Clergy on January 22, 1991, for "collective" intentions. Pope Paul VI in an Apostolic Letter dated June 15, 1974, clearly expressed the theological basis for Mass Offerings. In making a Mass offering, "by which they contribute in a particular way to the needs of the Church and especially to the sustenance of its ministers ... The faithful unite themselves more closely with Christ offering himself as a victim, thus, deriving more abundant fruit from the sacrifice." (See Canon 946) "Mass offerings can be understood as gifts to the Church or its ministers on behalf of some intention, much as a donation or bequest is made to any charitable institution in the name of some person, living or deceased." (New Commentary, Paulist Press, published 2000, page 1130)

HOW MUCH DOES A MASS COST? How much is a Mass? The question usually is asked by a parishioner at the presbytery or sacristy door who wants to have Mass offered for someone who has died or for some special intention. Most priests are uncomfortable with such questions because while they do not want to offend the person, they do not want to encourage a practice that reflects a very limited understanding of the laity's participation in the celebration of the Eucharist. To understand how the Mass stipend developed we need to look at the liturgical practice of the eighth and ninth centuries. With the missionary growth of the Church in western Europe more and more monks were ordained priests. Soon the monasteries were filled with monks celebrating "private" Masses. About the same time a rather pessimistic view had led people to conclude that even the faithful Christian would need to be purified in purgatory. It was also accepted, however, that the prayers of the Church, and especially the Mass, could gain a speedy release from what was popularly thought of as the "purifying fire of purgatory". But how did the Mass help someone who was not present? Theologians attempted to answer this question with the theology of the fruits of the Mass.

Requesting Mass to be celebrated and making an offering to the priest or monastery was established pastoral practice. It was presumed that all those who participated in a Mass obtained some "fruit" or grace. But with the increase in private Masses, the person who made the offering was usually not present at the Mass so the "fruit" that would have gone to that person was now transferred to the intention for which the priest had accepted the offering. The practice has not been without its critics throughout the centuries particularly when the link was lost between the offering and the participation of the donor in the Mass. It is not surprising, therefore, that the modern liturgical reforms with their emphasis on the participation of the faithful have led to a decline in the practice of Mass offerings. People now understand that they too are offering the Mass with the priest and that their intentions are as much part of that Mass as those of the priest. The only acceptable understanding of the Mass offering is to see it as a donation freely given for the work of the Church and not as a fee for service. This is reflected in the change in terminology in the revised Code of Canon Law which now speaks of "offerings" and not "stipends".

#### **BLESSING OF THE CRIBS**

On the 3rd Sunday of Advent, Gaudate Sunday, we invite families to bring their Cribs to Mass for the Blessing of the Cribs.

A Crib is a tangible and meaningful way to prepare for the coming of the Lord as both a Family and a Parish community.

If you do not already have a Crib your family puts out for Christmas please take the opportunity of the next few weeks to work together as a family in creating you own Crib. Please bring your Cribs to Mass on Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> December to be blessed. We look forward to seeing your Cribs.
