



PLEASE NOTE

Once you pick up a copy of the newsletter it needs to be taken home with you to ensure we adhere to COVID-19 protocols. Kindly DO NOT leave it behind after Mass has concluded.

The Covid-19 plan:

We are currently Level 1: with some additional Restrictions

Places of worship must be supervised by, and be clearly identified as, a COVID Marshal.

As of December 1, all public buildings have been provided a **QR Code.** This code is to be scanned using the MySAGov phone app or using the camera on your smart phone.

Arrangements listed below will be in force until further notice:

Our Parish is Committed to Health and Safety.

- 1. Please scan the **QR Code** located on the door or external wall of the church. If you do not have a smart phone, please complete the Contact Register upon entry.
- 2. Use the sanitizing gel provided at the Church entrance.
- 3. As of August 12, seating restrictions are as follows 3 person per 4 square metres.
- 4. MASKS are MANDATORY for shared indoor public places so EVERYONE MUST WEAR A MASK OVER THE NOSE & MOUTH WHILE INSIDE THE CHURCH. THERE IS A \$5000-FINE FOR THE CHURCH IF THIS IS NOT FOLLOWED SO PLEASE FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES WHILE INSIDE THE CHURCH. The Celebrant is permitted to remove their mask while saying Mass.
- 5. Holy Communion is given only in the hand.
- 6. Everyone must take reasonable steps to maintain 1.5m physical distancing at all times. People from the same household may sit together. Please keep the social distancing requirement when processing for Holy Communion and when leaving the Church after Mass.
- 7. Please remember to wipe down the area where you have been sitting/kneeling in the pews and use the sanitizing gel provided on your way out.
- 8. Please follow the ENTRY and EXIT rules.
- 9. If you are unwell please consider the health of our community and stay home until you are better.
- 10. As of September 9, Funerals & Weddings are now capped at 150 people but must have an independent COVID Marshal if more than 50 people are in attendance. Your cooperation with these requirements is greatly appreciated.

HOMILY ON FOURTH SUNDAY IN ADVENT, YEAR C (19/12/2021)



Scripture Readings: Mi 5:1-4a; Heb 10:5-10; Lk 1:39-45

Introduction: Today's readings remind us that Jesus is reborn every day in ordinary people living ordinary lives, who have the willingness to respond to God's call and the openness to do God's will. They suggest that Christmas should inspire us to carry out God's word as Mary and Jesus did, in perfect, loving obedience to His will, with cheerful kindness and unselfish generosity.

Scripture: In the first reading, the prophet Micah gives assurance to the Jews that God is faithful to His promises and that from the unimportant village of Bethlehem, He will send them the long-expected ruler. The third stanza of todays Responsorial Psalm (Ps. 80), is a prayer for God's blessing on the Davidic king, of whom we sing in the first. The second reading, taken from Paul's Letter to the Hebrews, reminds us to be thankful for Jesus Christs' Self-offering, the perfect sacrifice of loving obedience that liberated us from sin. In obedient, willing eagerness to do God's will, "Behold, I come to do Your will", Christ gave Himself in the place of all other ritual sacrifices offered as the means of sanctification. In the Gospel, Luke tells us how two seemingly insignificant women met to celebrate the kindness and fidelity of God. We see here how sensitive Mary was to the needs of Elizabeth, her older cousin who had miraculously become pregnant in her old age. For Luke, discipleship consists in listening to God's word and then carrying it out, and Mary does both, to become the most perfect disciple.

Application to Life: 1) We need to carry Jesus to others as Mary did. We can make a real difference in the lives of others by carrying Jesus to them. However, we cannot give what we do not possess. Christmas is the ideal time for us to be filled with the spirit of Christ, allowing His rebirth within us. Thus, Jesus enables us to share His love with all whom we encounter by offering them humble, loving, committed service, unconditional forgiveness, and compassionate care. Sharing Jesus with others is the best Christmas gift we can give. God wants each of us, like Mary, to carry to those around us the Lord of Life. 2) We need to bless and encourage the vounger generation. Elizabeth demonstrates the responsibility of the older generation to inspire the younger generation. We need others to recognize our gifts, to honour our true being, and to pronounce "the goodness of God upon us." We who are grandparents, parents, teachers, and leaders are responsible for encouraging those around us by saying, "You are an important person, valuable to God and to me." 3) We need to recognize the real presence of the Emmanuel (God Is with Us) and say "yes" to **Him:** The Visitation of Mary reminds us that Christ continues to be present among his people. Christ "dwells among us," exercising His Holy Ministry through our Ministerial Priests and Deacons, the Bible, the Sacraments, and in each of us in the praying community. The hill country of Judea is right here in our sanctuary. The same Jesus who dwelt in Mary's womb and caused John to leap in Elizabeth's womb, now dwells among us in our liturgy and in the Holy Eucharist. 4) Mary's pilgrimage should be our model: As we journey with Mary to the hill country, let us continue to contemplate our own life's journey — its joys and sorrows, its triumphs, and its tragedies. Our Christian journey began in Christ at the Baptismal font where He joined Himself to us forever. Our journey continues through Christ as He nourishes us along the way with the Food of his Word and the Food of his Flesh.
